People with autism spectrum disorder (ASD) exhibit many behaviors their family, teachers, and other supporters find challenging. What are the behaviors and ways of taking in the outside world that distinguish a person with an ASD from their "neurotypical" peers? Although these will vary according to the severity of a person's autism and their age and developmental level, there are core issues that affect most people with an autism spectrum disorder.

During this workshop, we will explore the following topics: types of challenging behaviors and their impact, identifying the cause (function) of the behavior, reducing and preventing problem behaviors, responding to individuals at each stage of the Crisis Cycle, integrating positive behavioral support strategies in the classroom, and more.
