High Energy Costs, Poor Indoor Air and Structural Deterioration

The hot buzzwords in the healthcare industry have always been patient comfort and air quality control. In the last 12 months, we have seen our children and community's health needs significantly change before our eyes. We need to take a similar approach to our school and public facilities as our beloved healthcare industry.

In most buildings, mechanical ventilation counteracts air leakage flow through the envelope by keeping a slightly positive indoor air pressure. This results in a loss of conditioned air through the envelope's air leakage paths. The result: (1) the energy used to condition the air has been wasted, and (2) moisture is deposited in the envelope, causing deterioration. The deterioration and holes in the building envelope welcome condensation, moisture, mildew, and mold damage in hidden cavities.

For the building owner, the economic cost of decaying building materials is very high. The life of an expensive building can be shortened, maintenance costs increased, and, most seriously from a liability point of view, the safety of people passing by who might be hit by pieces of the

building falling off. In the unfortunate event of a fire, the stack effect truly comes into its own, fueling the vertical spread of flames and smoke. Aesthetically, the appearance of a building often shows the tell-tale scars of air leakage. These are visible as efflorescence, water stains, flaking bricks, rust streaks, large holes in masonry and cracked and peeling finishes.


