JOC CORNER &

The Adjustment Factor

n the world of Job Order Contracting the contractors competitive bid is expressed as an adjustment factor or coefficient. This adjustment factor can also be thought of as their markup. The lower the adjustment factor the lower the price the contractor will offer. It is this adjustment factor that is applied to a set of pre-established prices, like Gordian or RS Means. These adjustment factors also tell you which contractor will always offer the lowest price. The one offering the lowest adjustment factor will always be the contractor that offers the best price. An example of an adjustment factor is 1.1500. An adjustment factor of 1.15 indicates that the contractor is willing to do the work for the pre-established prices found in the price book so long as they can add their competitively bid markup of 15%. This markup constitutes their competitive bid and this is how Job Order Contracting meets the state's requirement that all projects need to be purchased through a competitive bid.

With the use of JOC having multiple contractors look at the same project is unnecessary. If price is the most important aspect of each project the CES member should select the JOC contractor that offers the lowest adjustment factor. The JOC contractors bid different adjustment factors to CES and the one offering the lowest adjustment factor received the most points relative to price. If the CES member asks three different contractors to look at a project and the contractors offer adjustment factors of 1.15, 1.18 and 1.20 the contractor that offers the adjustment factor of 1.15 will always offer the lowest price. Knowing the contractor's adjustment factors ahead of time allows the CES member to make an informed choice and affords them the opportunity to save time and save money on their procurement efforts. The next time you have a project feel free to speak with three different JOC contractors and ask each one what their adjustment factor is. The one that responds with the lowest adjustment factor is the one that will offer the CES member the lowest price.
