

# Do you have an Esports program?

There has been a lot of news about Esports recently and with the most recent news of a 16 year old winning \$3 million playing Fortnite has changed how many are viewing gaming. So why is this important and why should schools pay attention to this?

Today, Esports is growing exponentially with over 400 million fans worldwide who repeatedly sell out arenas. Currently, there are more than 200 colleges and universities offering almost \$15 million dollars in scholarships. Establishing E- sports in high school enables students to do what they love and provides them with additional opportunities to earn recognition.

Esports is now a NMAA (New Mexico Activities Association) approved official activity with competition between individuals or teams. Esports will work just like "traditional sports that require skills, practices as well as academic requirements to participate. Districts like APS and Carlsbad have already embraced having an Esports program and started building teams and developing a competition and technology plan around this.

Why are districts like APS and Carlsbad supporting Esports? Their IT Directors Dr. Richard Bowman and Wayne Stephens saw the future and the benefits that the students receive.

#### **Benefits of Esports**

- Character Development Students build character and develop discipline, self-esteem and sportsmanship through practice and gameplay.
- Increase Participation Esports are co-ed, inclusive, and engage students who might not otherwise participate in school athletics or activities.
- STEM Engagement Esports players are often interested in STEM classes and programs. A high percentage of collegiate Esports players select STEM majors.
- College Scholarships More than 200 colleges and universities offer Esports scholarships and are actively recruiting players for Esports programs.

Esports brings out a new type of competition in the school system that has never been introduced before. Some students who wouldn't ever want to participate in a sport now have the opportunity to do so while representing their school and building a community on campus

There are many benefits to the Esports program that help unify the schools, but schools are there to educate the students, so why should educators embrace Esports?

For decades now, everyone said that kids screen time should be limited, it seems a little contradictory to form Esports clubs on high school campuses... After all, aren't teens supposed to stay away from video games? You'd be shocked to find out the incredible benefits by combining the worlds of Esports and education!

The main goal for this is to use Esports as a way to reach more students. As well as to help provide them with an opportunity to help that student grow.

Educators have the opportunity to go where the students are. The popularity of video games among high school students is undeniable and massive amount of high school students are playing games on a daily basis. If students are gaming against friends while they're at home, why not encourage community and connection by playing in a cooperative environment at school?

Getting students involved and wanting to be part of something at school is also a great way to reach students, especially those students that are typically not that active in the traditional student body.
