Co-teaching is a service delivery option for providing specialized instruction to students with special needs, as well as general education students, in which two teachers share instructional responsibilities in the classroom. This training provides participants the opportunity to explore the "what," the "why" (legal basis) and the "how" (logistics) of co-teaching in the inclusive setting. Training content includes:
